This is a copy of the letter sent to David Barrett:

In August of 2020, Mr. Barrett shutdown access to the gate on Lakeland Street for everybody. Mr. Barrett then reached out to the Greenforest Subdivision, in the Beaver Bank community, to form an association that would manage access to the gate. Volunteers got together and formed the Lakeland Gate Association (LGA). The volunteers now manage this gate; all the other gates are still managed by Mr. Barrett and the BLC key will work in all of them except for the Lakeland Street gate.

The Barrett Stewardship course is required first before you can gain access to the LGA gate. This course is managed by Mr. Barrett. Anyone who wants to take an OHV/ATV through this gate needs to show the volunteers of LGA a current BLC key and that they have insurance and a Barrett sticker before they are granted access.

The LGA manages the Lakeland gate with a Bluetooth lock. You will need a smartphone or tablet for the Bluetooth access to the lock on this gate. This Bluetooth lock provides information as to who is using the lock allowing LGA to assist with any issues. Access is \$20/year, with renewal every spring while all gates are closed for spring thaw. The LGA has a separate contract that needs to be signed and is aligned with the Barrett Stewardship rules.
